The 2010 CAJLE Annual Conference will be held on the campus of the University of British Columbia in beautiful Vancouver, the site of 2010 Winter Olympics, for three consecutive days from Friday August 13 through Sunday August 15. The conference will include a keynote speech, concurrent paper presentations, workshops, a round-table discussion, and an expert panel discussion. We are honoured to have the internationally renowned scholar, Professor Seiichi Makino of Princeton University, as our keynote speaker at this year's conference. We are also pleased to announce that scholars from Japan, the U.S. and Canada will lead workshops, a round-table discussion and a panel discussion. These include Professors Nobuko Chikamatsu (Professor, DePaul University, U.S.), Patsy Duff (University of British Columbia, Canada), Ryuko Kubota (University of British Columbia), Yuriko Sunakawa (Tsukuba University), Suwako Watanabe (Portland State University) and a group of specialists in Japanese literature from the University of British Columbia including Professors Stefania Burk, Christina Laffin, Joshua Mostow and Sharalyn Orbaugh.

The theme for this year's conference is "Emerging Possibilities for Japanese Language Education: Integrating Language, Content and Culture." We aim at gathering together researchers from all related academic fields including Japanese linguistics, pedagogy, language education, and Japanese studies as well as Japanese language teachers from all levels of institutions to explore this theme from a variety of perspectives. Through the sharing of their theories, practices and challenges, we hope to gain insights that will be useful for designing more innovative curricula and assessment methods, as well as for developing more effective teaching materials.

The Canadian Association for Japanese Language Education (CAJLE) is pleased to announce that its 22nd Annual Conference will be held at the University of British Columbia in Vancouver from Friday, August 13 through Sunday, August 15. This conference will gather together teachers of the Japanese language and academics in related fields from institutions around the world. In addition to paper presentations, the conference will feature a keynote speech by Professor Seiichi Makino of Princeton University, as well as workshops and an expert panel discussion currently slated to include Professor Yuriko Sunagawa of University of Tsukuba, Professor Nobuko Chikamatsu of DePaul University, Professor Suwako Watanabe of Portland State University, Professors Ryuko Kubota and Professor Patricia Duff of University of British Columbia.

We invite submissions of abstracts for paper presentations on topics including, but not limited to, Japanese linguistics, Japanese language pedagogy, Japanese as a heritage language, as well as innovative teaching techniques. Submissions related to the conference theme are especially welcome. The allocated time for each paper including questions and discussion will be 30 minutes. We also welcome group submissions on a common theme. Presentations may be given in either Japanese or English.

- 1) paper title (in both Japanese and English),
- 2) one-page abstract (in either Japanese or English),
- 3) name(s) of the presenter(s) (in both Japanese and English),
- 4) current affiliation and title (in Japanese and English),
- 5) contact information including e-mail address, phone number, and postal address.

Selected presenters at the conference will be invited after the conference to submit their papers for article length publication in Volume 12 of *Journal CAJLE*. Those submissions will undergo a separate reviewing process set by the standards of the journal.
